

STUDENT LICENSURE DISCLOSURES

FOR PROGRAMS LEADING TO STATE-REGULATED LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION



FEDERAL REGULATIONS AND NC-SARA POLICY

UCF must disclose to students publicly and individually if their program prepares them for state-regulated licensure or certification in the state in which they are located.

3 DETERMINATIONS

For each state, UCF must list whether the program: (1) meets educational requirements, (2) does not meet educational requirements, or (3) if we cannot confirm whether the program meets educational requirements.



STATE LICENCING BOARD CONTACT INFORMATION

For any program in which we cannot confirm whether the program meets educational requirements, we must provide that state's licensing board contact information.

92 DISCLOSURES

APQ has collaborated with 8 colleges to craft 92 disclosures for programs leading to state-regulated professional licensure or certification.

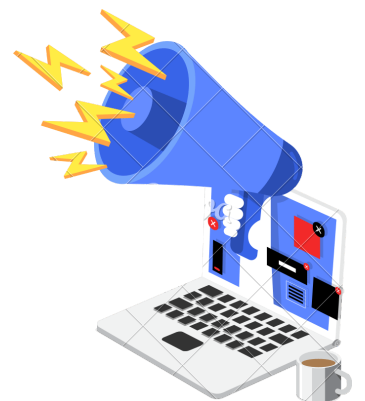


PUBLIC DISCLOSURES

DIRECT DISCLOSURES

Individual disclosures are sent directly to prospects who complete inquiry forms and admits prior to their enrollment via email from the Admissions Offices. Students who change majors are sent an email upon major change request.



ANNUAL UPDATES

APQ annually reviews the disclosures with the colleges to update contact information, edit guidance to students, and adjust according to new or revised regulations.
