



DISCLOSURE REGARDING PROGRAM PREPARATION FOR PROFESSIONAL LICENSURE OR CERTIFICATION

The University of Central Florida is committed to providing clear and accurate information to current and prospective students to help inform career planning. The UCF program identified above prepares students for state-regulated professional licensure or certification. However, specific licensure and certification requirements may vary by state or territory. Requirements typically include earning a degree or other educational credential from an institution and program that meet certain requirements in that state (e.g., specific coursework, accredited status); passing a state or national exam; and/or working in the field for a period of time or completing a certain number of clinical hours. If your career plans include pursuing professional licensure or certification, it is important to become educated on the credentialing requirements of the state in which you intend to practice.

Effective July 1, 2024, federal regulation requires the university to meet all educational requirements for state-regulated licensure or certification in every US state and territory where its eligible programs are offered. This disclosure is intended to provide you with information regarding the educational preparation you will receive in your chosen program of studyⁱ.

UCF Program Preparation in the State of Florida

The Nursing (BSN) program is designed for in-person course delivery in the State of Florida, although some limited online options may be available. Please review the enrollment restrictions noted below.

This program meets the educational requirements for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN) in the State of Florida. For information on all requirements for this credentialⁱⁱ, please review the Florida Board of Nursing licensure requirements available here: <https://floridasnursing.gov/registered-nurse/>.

Students who graduate from this program at UCF will meet the educational eligibility criteria for the National Council for Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) for obtaining their license to practice as a registered nurse in Florida. UCF's Registrar's Office will first verify and confirm all degree requirements have been satisfied. UCF College of Nursing will then provide a list of NCLEX-RN BSN degree candidates to Florida's State Board of Nursing. We recommend that students take the NCLEX-RN within 4-8 weeks of graduation.

Enrollment Eligibility Restrictionsⁱⁱⁱ

To comply with federal and state-level restrictions, this program may only enroll students who will be physically located within the State of Florida for the duration of their program of study, including both didactic and clinical experiences. Should you be physically located outside of Florida for more than a vacation or brief visit, regardless of your legal state of residence, you will be unable to apply or continue your enrollment in this program.

UCF Program Preparation in Other US States and Territories^{iv}

We have not determined whether the Nursing (BSN) program meets the educational requirements for graduates to be eligible to apply for licensure or certification in any additional states.

If you are interested in seeking licensure outside of the State of Florida, we encourage you to review the appropriate state licensing board information to determine all requirements needed to obtain your credential of interest. Programmatic Accreditation^v

UCF's Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) programs are nationally accredited by the Commission of Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE). Programmatic accreditation is typically required for state-regulated licensure in this field. Recognition by CCNE is specific to the program and is distinct from [UCF's institutional accreditation](#) that is required for other purposes, including UCF's authorization to award federal financial aid to students.

Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC) Information

As Florida is part of the Nurse Licensure Compact (NLC), nurses with a RN license in the state of Florida may be eligible to apply for a compact license to practice in the other NLC states, districts and US territories. This list is continually updating pending legislative changes. UCF Program Eligibility Outside the United States

This disclosure does not address program eligibility in countries outside the United States.
